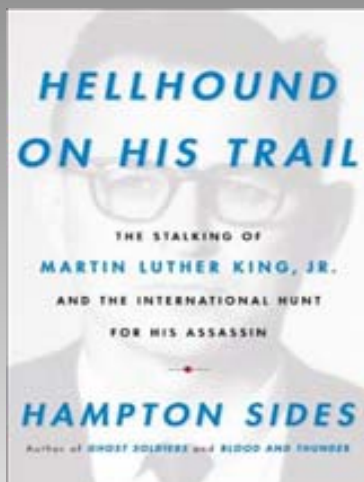




Hampton Sides

Hampton Sides is one of America's most respected historians and journalists. His previous book, *Ghost Soldiers*, about the rescue of the Bataan Death March survivors, was made into a blockbuster movie that *Esquire Magazine* called, the greatest story of World War Two. His new book, *Hellhound on His Trail* is scheduled to be released the week before his Kiwanis appearance. This riveting analysis follows the tracking of Martin Luther King, Jr. by James Earl Ray. Lt. Gen. Dick Newton is the Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Personnel, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C. General Newton serves as the senior Air Force officer responsible for comprehensive plans and policies covering all life cycles of military and civilian personnel management, which includes military and civilian end strength management, education and training, compensation, resource allocation, and the worldwide USAF services program.

Born at Forbes Air Force Base, Kan., General Newton hails from an Air Force family and graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1978. His command assignments include the first B-2 squadron, a B-1B operations group and a B-52 wing. He served at Headquarters U.S. Air Force as a planner and then executive officer for the Deputy Chief of Staff for Plans and Operations, and later as Deputy Director for Strategic Plans and Future Systems for the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel. His joint assignments include serving as the executive assistant to the Director, Strategic Plans and Policy (J5), with later assignment as Deputy Director for Information Operations, and Deputy Director for Global Operations in the Operations Directorate (J3) on the Joint Staff, followed by duty as the Director, Plans and Policy (J5), U.S. Strategic Command. Most recently he served as the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations, Plans and Requirements, Headquarters U.S. Air Force.

General Newton is a command pilot with over 2,900 flying hours in a variety of aircraft, including the B-2, B-1B, B-52 and T-38.

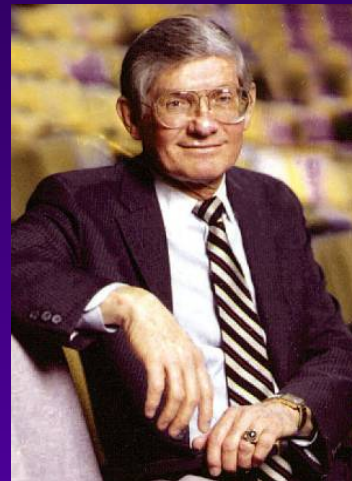

Joe Dean, Sr.
Motivational Speaker and
Athletic Consultant



Joe Dean served as director of athletics at Louisiana State University for 14 years. He was one of the most widely respected athletic administrators in collegiate athletics, having served as athletic director at LSU longer than any other person in the history of the school.

During his tenure at LSU, Joe helped the athletic program realize athletic, financial and academic success as well as spearheading numerous facility improvements. Under Joe's direction, LSU won more national championships (27) than in the entire previous history of the school. He also made great strides in facility improvements including a state-of-the-art medical facility and an expansive weight training facility for the use of athletes in all 20 sports. It was also under Joe's leadership that great strides were made in women's athletics. His proactive approach to increasing opportunities for women's sports made Tiger athletics a pacesetter in Title IX and gender equity issues. Joe was also fully committed to the academic development of student athletes having instituted the Academic Center for Athletes, which contributed to success in the classroom.

Since retirement, Joe has worked as an athletic consultant assisting athletic departments around the country with a variety of issues including hires and building plans. A noted motivational speaker, Joe will be addressing the 2010 Athletic Award winners at this week's meeting.

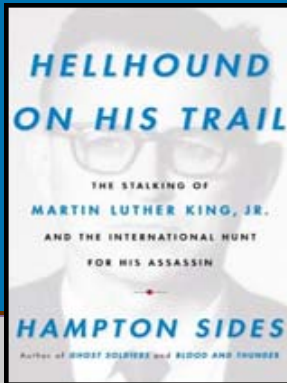
