Jay Grinney was appointed president and chief executive officer of HealthSouth Corporation on May 10, 2004. With 22,000 employees and 100 hospitals, HealthSouth is the nation's largest provider of inpatient rehabilitation services. Operating in 26 states across the country and in Puerto Rico, HealthSouth serves more than 250,000 patients annually through its network of inpatient rehabilitation hospitals, long-term acute care hospitals, outpatient rehabilitation satellites, and home health agencies.

Jay has an extensive background in the healthcare industry. Prior to joining HealthSouth, he served as President of the Eastern Group of HCA – Hospital Corporation of America, which consisted of 91 acute-care hospitals located in 10 states with annual net revenues of \$10.5 billion and employing more than 65,000 people. In his tenure with HCA, he also served as President of the Greater Houston Division and Chief Executive Officer of Rosewood Medical Center. Before joining HCA, Grinney held several senior-level executive positions during his nine-year career at The Methodist Hospital System in Houston a large, not-for-profit health care system that served as the primary teaching affiliate for the Baylor College of Medicine.

Jay is active on numerous industry boards and community organizations, serving on the board of directors for the Birmingham Regional Chamber of Commerce and United Way of Central Alabama. He has also served as chairman of the board for the Federation of American Hospitals, the national representative of privately owned and managed community hospitals and health systems throughout the United States.

After receiving a bachelor's degree from St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minn., Grinney earned both an MBA and an MHA from Washington University in St. Louis, Mo.

2009 ATHLETIC AWARDS



The area's 2009 outstanding senior athletes were recognized last Tuesday at our annual Athletic Awards Program. The guest speaker for the event was John Croyle, Founder and Executive Director of The Big Oak Ranch, Inc. John inspired the attendees and their families with a motivational talk.

The athletic awards were established by the club in the late 1960's to honor local high school seniors who excel in athletics and scholarship and to recognize area high schools with outstanding athletic programs.

This year the Athletic Awards Committee reviewed the stats and score books of athletes and high schools throughout Jefferson County and Shelby County. The prestigious William Legg Achievement Award (named in honor of long-time committee chair and co-chair, William "Bill" Legg) was awarded to **Madeline Morgan of Mountain Brook**. Madeline excels in the classroom and has received national attention in track and cross country. Along with a 4.36 GPA, she scored a 31 on the ACT and has been named a National Merit Finalist. She was named All-American nine times, seven in track and two in cross country. She holds the state record in the 1600 and 3200 meter events. She will attend Duke University on a Track scholarship in the fall. In addition Madeline finds time to be active in her church bible studies and youth groups. A talented vocal performer she has been selected as a member of the high school's prestigious Honors Concert Choir. In addition to Madeline receiving a trophy, the Mountain Brook High School Athletic Fund received a contribution of \$1,000 from the club in her honor.
